### Questions

**Section A Shakespeare:** students will answer one question on their play of choice (Macbeth). They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play and then to write about the play as a whole.

**Section B The 19th-century novel:** students will answer one question on their novel of choice (A Christmas Carol). They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the novel and then to write about the novel as a whole.

# Literature Paper 2: Modern texts and poetry

### What's assessed

An Inspector Calls

The poetry anthology

Unsee poetry

### How it's assessed

- written exam: 2 hour 15 minutes
- 96 marks
- 60% of GCSE

### Questions

**Section A Modern texts:** students will answer one essay question from a choice of two on their studied modern prose or drama text (An Inspector Calls).

**Section B Poetry:** students will answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from their chosen anthology cluster.

**Section C Unseen poetry:** Students will answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing this poem with a second unseen poem.

# How can you help your child to revise?

 Set aside specific times in the week to revise for History – revision works best when it is part of their regular routine. Ensure that they have at least two revision slots in a week for History.

- Your child will be given a summary of the core content they need to know for each exam. Encourage your child to revise the topics they are *least* confident with.
- Set goals for their revision sessions e.g. 'By the end of today I'm going to be able to recall
  the main forms of law enforcement in medieval England'. After their session, ask them how
  they know they achieved their goal.
- Use the mark schemes on the OCR website to improve any exam questions they complete – exemplar answers can also be found by following the QR code.

**Peterborough** – this part of the course is a bespoke unit, based on a local site. The best revision resource for this unit is their exercise book but an additional visit to the Cathedral over the Easter/May half term would be valuable – especially if they could act as a tour guide for friends and family.


# **Online Support**

The Maths department subscribes to many different sites and promotes many free sites that pupils can use to support their home learning and independent work.

**SparxMaths** <a href="https://www.sparxmaths.uk/">https://www.sparxmaths.uk/</a> – This is our primary subscription site, due to the quality of the videos, the individualised nature of the home learning tasks, and the ability for students to challenge themselves with extra study.

Sparx home learning is set every Monday for year 11, and due the following Monday. Tasks set will be a revision of knowledge taught at different stages of the GCSE Scheme of Learning.

SparxMaths will provide a video lesson to support your child in the area selected, and then provide a quiz to check their understanding. It also has a 'book check' section that ensures students are writing their working out/answers down on paper to refer to.



**Corbett Maths https://corbettmaths.com/** – is a free site that your child can access. It provides a great deal of supporting material and question practice.

A key area that your child may find useful is the '5-a-day'. Your child needs to be sure to select the '5-a-day GCSE 9-1' to ensure they are getting suitable questions.



The '5-a-day' is designed to give pupils 5 questions for each day of the year to practice different areas of the maths GCSE. They come complete with answers by clicking on the answers link on the page. The answers are particularly beneficial as they are modelled to show the calculations required rather than just the answer.

There are also further practice questions and worksheets, designed to support your child with areas they may find difficult.


