When you have created your piece of work, we'd love to see it so please upload it to Teams!


If you do a 3D model, painting, drawing, etc please take a picture of it and upload it.





















Who made the rivers, Who made the hills, the skies, the sea? Who made the valleys, Who made the flowers, the birds, the trees?

Reminder of the Themes that you can choose from

Each year, 4 themes are chosen for the Spirited Arts Competition. The themes for this year's competition are:

A. God's good earth?

Are we spoiling God's good earth? Should we be thankful for it? Can we save it in time from the threats of climate change? The beauty of the earth is celebrated in many religions, but the human spoiling of the earth is a danger and a coming crisis. Can you make a work of art that shows what you think about our beautiful world? Does it belong to God? To us? To all the animals? Should we pray for the world?

B. Holy Words!

What words are holy for you? Select saying or stories you love about peace, faith, unity, prayer or another spiritual idea. Incorporate your holy words into your artwork. What is so great abut the holy words you chose? Use quotations from holy books you love or have learned about in RE. What about some non-religious wise words?

C. Where is God?

Is God in your heart? In prayer? In the temple of the universe? Or is she hiding? Not there at all? Looking for God is something almost everyone does sometimes but how are we doing in finding God? Would you search with google? Is God on Instagram, tiktok or whatsapp? Can God be found in prayer? Use varied views from different religions and beliefs and your own ideas to make a work of art on this theme.

D. Inspiring!

What inspired you? A song? A quote? Another person's life? A place? Religion offers people inspiration to live. Sometimes an inspirational life, a person's example, a text or a piece of music crystallizes our inspiration. In this theme, you are invited to identify what inspired you from a religion – it doesn't have to be your own faith, as inspiration tends to spill over the edges of religions. Explain through your art and text what connects your inspiration to spiritual or religious life.
